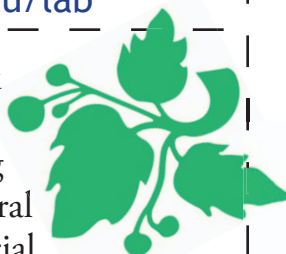

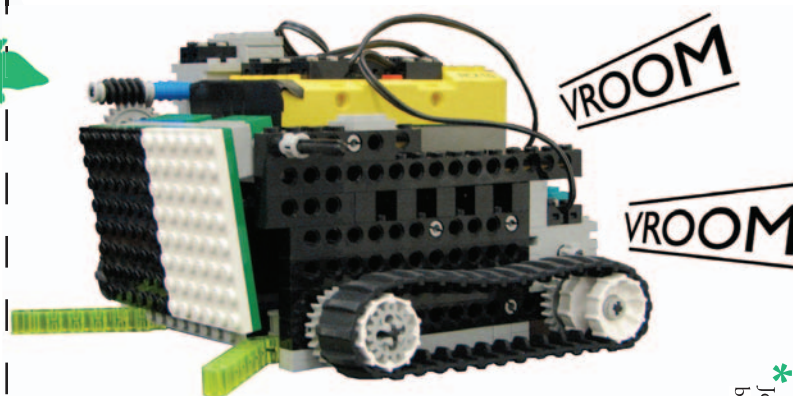
In honor of Garden Week (April 22-29) the Library will host an exhibit featuring botanical prints and natural history materials from Special Collections.



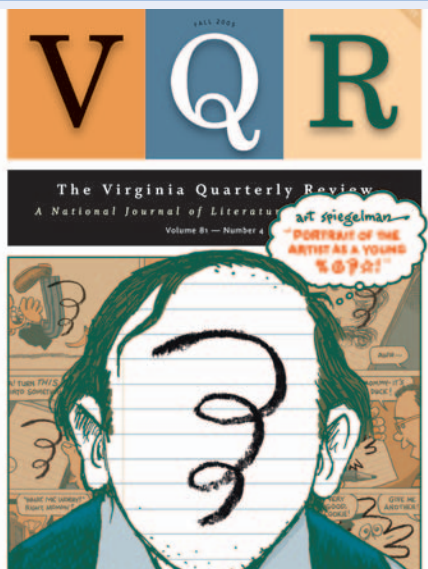
To take a peek, visit the first-floor gallery of the Harrison Institute and Special Collections Library later this month.

Gallery Talks: of Mice and Carpentry

If you didn't have a chance to attend the graphic novels talk at the Book Fest in March, you have a second chance to learn a little something about this colorful and occasionally controversial genre. On April 12, Ted Genoways, Senior Editor of the *Virginia Quarterly Review*, will lead a Gallery Talk on the life and times of Art Spiegelman, creator of the *Maus* series of graphic novels.

And on April 26 learn about the 17th-century tools and trades behind the building of Mr. Jefferson's University. Robert Self, Conservator of Architecture and Furniture at Monticello, will explore what it took to turn a series of plans and ideas into the physical space that is the Academical Village.
